## 1st Sergeant's Column

The company has two events for the month of November, the Capital of the Confederacy's Civil War Show (16-17 Nov) in Richmond, VA, and the Remembrance Day Parade (23 Nov) held in Gettysburg, PA. The CW Show is a major recruiting effort for the company which definitely needs your support given our low strength levels, while the Remembrance Day Parade is our continuing effort to honor our fighting Confederate ancestors. Please see the following information for needed coordination of your participation at either or both of these events.

The Capital of the Confederacy's Civil War Show (Sat/Sun, 16-17 Nov)— This is one of the premier and the oldest CW collector shows in the nation and is an opportunity not only to recruit for F Co, but to improve your knowledge of not only CW artifacts, but Confederate military history as well. The show will run from 9-5 on Sat, and 9-3 on Sun. Your uniform serves as your free admission to the show. Captain Turley definite needs your services in manning the F Co recruiting tables

during this two day show. The show is located at the Richmond Raceway Complex, Old Dominion Bldg., 600 E. Laburnum Ave, Richmond, VA.

Gettysburg Remembrance Day Parade (Sat, 23 Nov)- This is one of the best American Civil War military parades held in this country! It's our opportunity to demonstrate our ability w/marching as well as turning out like well-dressed soldiers. We need at least 10 uniformed soldiers to make-up an effective marching contingent w/our own Confederate colors. So yes you need to make the effort to attend!

We will assemble at the Unity Park by one of the large oak trees. Unity Park is located at the corner of Baltimore and Lefever Streets in Gettysburg. You can't miss it as it's the center of all the parade activity. You need to be present by 1130 as the parade starts at 1300 hours so you'll have sufficient time to find suitable parking due to large crowd in town, and we need to have a short rehearsal of drill for our participation.

## Specific Uniform Requirements for Parade

- (1) Uniform- Kepi (NO slouch hats) w/cleaning matching uniform jacket and trousers w/accoutrements and canteen (filled!), but NO haversack. What is usually called "light marching order".
- (2) Accourrements and Brogans- All leather items must be polished, that is, you need to clean and polish cartridge box, cap pouch, belt and bayonet scabbard plus cartridge box sling if you use one. Additionally, ALL brass must be polished including uniform and kepi buttons, belt plates and bayonet tips.
- (3) Reminder- This is a military parade, not a field event!!! You need to present an exceptional personal appearance which does honor both to yourself and our Confederate ancestors! This is how F Co, 21<sup>st</sup> VA demonstrates its support of both Southern history and America!
