Read: 1 Peter 5:5-9

Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you. —1 Peter 5:6-7

In the 19th century, ships were often recklessly overloaded, resulting in those ships going down and the crews being lost at sea. In 1875, to remedy this negligent practice, British politician Samuel Plimsoll led the charge for legislation to create a line on the side of a ship to show if it

was carrying too much cargo. That "load line" became known as the Plimsoll Line, and it continues to mark the hulls of ships today.

# Uniform and Equipage Committee

The following is being provided by the F Co Uniform and Equipage Committee in support of F Company's military impression w/authentic and serviceable military equipment.

### Care and Maintenance of CS Wood Canteen

Cherry wood canteens are coming into the F Co inventory again which require seasoning and continued maintenance in order to be useable. Please note the following:

To prepare your wood canteen for use you need to soak it for 5-7 days w/water so that all the joints swell completely. Fill canteen w/water and check daily to refill as it will leak and loose water thru evaporation. If after a full 7 days the canteen will still not hold water without leaking then following the next step:

Totally impress the canteen in container of water w/a weight to hold it down so that inside and outside of canteen body is completely filled/covered in water. Soak again for 5-7 days checking daily to see if it is holding water. The wood will discolor and bands will rust, but this is necessary at this point to get canteen to hold water. If after a full 7 days of immersion the canteen still won't hold water then contact Mike Vice at <a href="michaelvice 16@msn.com">michaelvice 16@msn.com</a> or better call him at 210-683-7323 (Cell) and we'll discuss return of canteen for a replacement.

Once you've gotten your canteen to hold water then it requires continued maintenance, that is, you must keep it full of water when not in the field otherwise if it dries out it will be very hard to get it to swell again and hold water and in fact it might not work at all. This means that thru the winter months when canteen is stored you need to periodically check it to make sure it is full of water at all times. You've spent a lot of money on this item so take care of it!

### Source for Canvas Shelter Half

Shelter halves can be had again from a former F Co member, Phil Cavanaugh, who previously owned and operated the Haversack Depot. These shelter halves are as authentic as other sources and are slightly cheaper. You will need to purchase these shelter halves on EBay, so follow these steps. Go onto Ebay and type in "civil war shelter half" which should take you to his site. You will know you're on Phil's site when you see shelter half priced at \$79.00 plus \$9.50 for shipping as well as site being located in Conroe, Texas and mentioned as being the former Haversack Depot. Remember you are bidding on this item, but you should be able to get it for the price I've shown. Also remember you only get one shelter half without any poles or stakes. If you want a full tent then you need to buy two or get your messmate to buy one w/you so that both shelter halves button up together.

Merge onto I-295 North via EXIT 200 toward WASHINGTON

Merge onto I-95 North via EXIT 43A on the LEFT toward WASHINGTON

Merge onto VA-54 West via EXIT 92B toward ASHLAND

Turn LEFT onto US-1/South WASHINGTON HWY

Turn RIGHT onto MYRTLE ST

407 MYRTLE ST is on the LEFT

### From Points North Of Richmond:

Take I-95 South toward RICHMOND.

Merge onto VA-54 West /ENGLAND ST via EXIT 92 toward ASHLAND

Turn LEFT onto US-1/South WASHINGTON HWY

Turn RIGHT onto MYRTLE ST

407 MYRTLE ST is on the LEFT

### From Points South Of Richmond:

Take I-95 North toward Richmond.

Merge onto VA-54 West via EXIT 92B toward ASHLAND

Turn LEFT onto US-1/South WASHINGTON HWY

Turn RIGHT onto MYRTLE ST

407 MYRTLE ST is on the LEFT

I-95 South

Take the I-295 exit, EXIT 84B, toward CHARLOTTESVILLE. 0.4 mi

Take the US-1 S exit on the LEFT toward RICHMOND. 0.2 mi

Merge onto I-295 N via the exit on the LEFT toward I-64 W/CHARLOTTESVILLE. 8.5 mi

Merge onto I-64 W via EXIT 53A toward CHARLOTTESVILLE. 2.5 mi

Merge onto VA-288 S/WORLD WAR II VETERANS MEMORIAL HWY via EXIT 175 toward CHESTERFIELD. 12 mi

Merge onto US-60 W toward POWHATAN. 8.5 mi

Turn LEFT onto DORSET RD. 1.6 mi

DORSET RD. becomes SCHROEDER RD. 3.3 mi

SCHROEDER RD. becomes GENITO RD. 3.6 mi

GENITO RD. becomes VA-604/CHULA RD. Continue to follow CHULA RD. 1.8 mi

Turn LEFT onto COVERLY RD.

Beginning at the corner of Chula Rd and Coverly Rd follow the F Co. signs.

Merge onto VA-288 N/WORLD WAR II VETERANS MEMORIAL HWY via EXIT 62 toward CHESTERFIELD/POWHITE PKWY. 14 mi

Merge onto US-360 W toward AMELIA. 18 mi

Turn RIGHT onto CHULA RD. 3.0 mi

Turn RIGHT onto COVERLY RD.

Beginning at the corner of Chula Rd and Coverly Rd follow the F Co. signs.
