Dear F Company Supporter,

After more than 10 years our F Company website needs to be re-constructed and reset using updated software and technology, that meets today's technical standards, makes the site functional, easier to manage, as well as accessible to mobile and standard devices. Over the past years, our website has provided F Company with a professional platform resulting in many potential member contacts, donators and Civil War interested parties. The job however requires expertise that our current membership does not possess. Therefore, we need to hire experts to complete this task. After a concentrated effort of interviewing several firms and receiving many proposals, we are currently estimating between \$600 and \$800 will be needed for the initial set up. The executive committee has approved a contract with a professional firm and now we must find a way to pay for this service. We are asking our members and supporters to consider supporting this effort by making a tax deductible donation of \$30 or more. We hope you will support F Company in this effort.
